Dear Friends at Landrum UMC,

Officially in June 2024 at the SC Annual Conference, I will begin a new journey as I have requested to retire after serving congregations for the past ten years with the last three years being here at Landrum UMC. While I had hope to serve (if appointed) here another year, LUMC, has chosen a different path. And, so have I.

My time here has been made special by so many of you. I love that now while serving each of you communion, I can call your name. And I have been blessed as you have called me by name as your pastor over the last three years. You are a congregation filled with love for God and love for the community. My daily prayer is that as you leave the UMC denomination and become a "new" church, Landrum Methodist, you will continue to love God and to love and serve all in your community as you follow Jesus' example of welcoming the stranger, the outcast.

Officially, I will be your pastor through June 30, 2024, and over the next few months I will be making plans for retirement to Aiken, SC, unless God leads me elsewhere. I want to thank you for receiving me as your pastor in July of 2021. I am thankful to have been appointed to this congregation especially as I journeyed through my cancer diagnosis that began in August of 2022. It may seem odd to give thanks for cancer, but I saw many times where this journey of mine gave me opportunities to share my faith with others. And it gave many of you an opportunity to tell me of your own health journeys and more than you will know these gave me a sense of hope and gave me courage because I had seen both hope and courage and strength in each of you and your families. I pray for you as God is leading you on your next journey as individuals, families, and as a church.

As you look for direction for this church and I look to God for his direction in my life, this season of Lent gives us all a chance to slow our pace and focus on Jesus. Each week Jesus draws closer to Jerusalem and the cross. I am glad that on Easter morning we will be filled with hope. Hope in his resurrection and all that means for us. That through his death on the cross, he took our sins and died for us so that we might have life eternal. Hope is my word for 2024 and there is great hope because the tomb is empty. We will shout together, He is risen! He is risen indeed!

The Good Shepherd

As a child I remember a picture of Jesus, his right hand holding a shepherd's staff and his left arm cradled a lamb with a bandaged leg. Behind him a flock of sheep follow along the lush green banks of a flowing stream. The serenity and calm of that painting shaped my understanding of Jesus being my shepherd and has stayed with me for years. I read a devotion and learned a lot about shepherds - how they were always vigilant, scanning the landscape for carnivores and strays. They went to great lengths and took great risks to find lost sheep.

At night, shepherds brought their flocks to a watering hole where herds mixed together to the point that the shepherds couldn't tell one sheep from another. So how did they sort the flocks? Sheep were fond of their shepherd and the security of his presence. All he had to do was call them. They knew his voice and responded to it. They followed that voice and that voice only. Jesus said, "He calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. They will not follow a stranger."

There were small enclosures that held single flocks. The borders of stacked stones barely four feet high had one way in and out but with no gate. At night, the shepherd laid across the opening. Sheep wouldn't step over him nor would thieves. They had to jump the wall to steal sheep. The shepherd was the gate that provided protection and passage. "Very truly, I tell you, I am the gate for the sheep," Jesus said. "Whoever enters by me will be saved and will come in and go out and find pasture."

What a wonderful place to be -- inside the gate. Yet this gate has no lock. We're not allowed to lock ourselves in. We can't rest all safe and cozy and disregard what happens outside. The gate can't be locked to keep out the people who aren't like us. Jesus is the one who determines who gets in and who comes out. We are sheep. We heed the shepherd's voice and follow His leads. Jesus doesn't lock us up to keep us from the world. Once we go through the gate to delight in green pastures, we always will belong to Him, we are still able to venture outside the gate. When we leave and go out into the world – we are vulnerable to sheep stealers and slick voices who will try to fleece us. We rely on our shepherd.

In John 10:16 Jesus said, "I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice.' There will be one flock, one shepherd. Jesus, the good shepherd, being the gate between abundant life and abundant despair. Leading us to green pastures and still waters.

Glenn welcomed everyone to the meeting. Ted Andrus moved to approve the Jan. 14 meeting minutes and Jaime Wofford seconded and the motion passed. George Ashmore moved to approve the Jan. 28 meeting minutes and Cheryl Every seconded and the motion passed. Glenn then turned the meeting over to George Ashmore for an update on the transition.


The first thing discussed was the funding plan. The District Superintendent said we could not use the property as collateral for a bank loan, so we are moving to Plan B which has two options. The motion passed with a majority of yays, with 4 abstentions.


